Jenn's Cooking Corner

Blintzes

Ingredients

1 (3 oz) package cream cheese (not whipped)

1 egg yolk

1 Tbl sugar

20 pieces of fresh white bread

6 Tbl butter

1 tsp cinnamon

3 tsp sugar

optional: blueberries or sliced strawberries

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F.
- 2. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper.
- 3. In a mixing bowl beat the cream cheese, egg yolk and sugar with an electric mixer at medium speed until smooth and creamy. Set aside.
- 4. With a heart or round cookie cutter, cut the shape out of the center of each piece of white bread one slice at a time. Feed the crusts to the birds!
- 5. Place a heaping teaspoon of the cream cheese mixture in the center of 10 of the bread shapes. At this point you can leave them plain or add a few blueberries or a slice of strawberry. Cover each with a second shape.
- 6. With your fingers, go around the very edges of the "sandwich" to pinch the two pieces of bread together. Then go around again, this time with the tines of a fork. This will give a pretty edge and will firmly seal the seams. Place the blintz sandwiches on the prepared cookie sheet.
- 7. Place the butter into a small microwave-safe bowl and microwave for 45 seconds, or until it melts.
- 8. Stir in the cinnamon and sugar. Using a pastry brush, carefully brush both sides of the "sandwich" with mixture. Be generous. Really brush it on!
- 9. Place in the oven and bake for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and allow to cool for a few minutes.

Alissa's Bake Shop

Cream Cheese Pound Cake

Ingredients

1½ cups butter, softened

1 pkg (8 oz) Philadelphia Cream Cheese softened

3 cups sugar

6 eggs

2 tsp vanilla extract

1 tsp lemon extract

3 cups all-purpose flour

½ tsp baking powder 1/4 tsp salt

Confectioner's sugar, sliced fresh strawberries and whipped cream, optional

Directions

In a large bowl, cream the butter, cream cheese and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in extracts. Combine the flour, baking powder and salt; beat into creamed mixture until blended.

Pour into a greased and floured 10 in fluted tube pan. Bake at 325° F for $11/4 - 1\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean.

Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to cool completely. Garnish with confectioner's sugar, strawberries and whipped cream if desired.
