



Pre-Camp Outdoor Tennis Clinics

The warm weather has finally arrived and we are very excited to announce that Eagle's Landing will be offering spring tennis clinics. The clinics are designed to meet players' current levels and participants will be instructed on how to use proper technique as well as focus on the different athletic aspects of tennis play.

The clinics will run from May 4th through June 28th. We are offering full 8 week sessions as well as drop-in session(s) to help work around busy schedules. The cost of the 8 week session is \$240 and drop in sessions are \$40 per session. Please refer to the schedule below for days, times and complete clinic descriptions. ~Clinic Descriptions~

Pee Wees (Ages 4-6) & Beginners (Ages 7-10)

Mondays at 4:15 - 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm Introduction for kids with little to no tennis experience. Focus is on ball-eye-hand coordination and basic stroke.

Ultimate Tennis (Ages 9-13)

Mondays at 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm Geared towards advanced juniors. Prepares players to move into tournament play. Focuses on stroke fundamentals, footwork patterns and strategy.

Tournament Training (Ages 12 - 16)

Thursdays at 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm Program is geared toward competitive tennis playing. Focus is on juniors interested in UTSA tournaments and trying out for middle and high school tournaments.

High Performance Competitive Levels

Sundays at 10:00 am - 12:00 pm For players competing in USTA tournaments or playing on school teams. Special emphasis on complete tactical, mental and physical training aspects. Challenges young players to achieve their full potential.

In addition to offering clinics for campers we are also excited to be offering *Adult Tennis Clinics*. Whether you are brand new to tennis, want to spice up your typical tennis routine, or just want to get in a different kind of cardio regime, we have the clinic for you. These clinics offer adult tennis players a chance to learn new skills in a

group setting.

Clinics are available for all abilities and skill levels. Our tennis professional will be happy to evaluate your level and place you in the clinic that is best suited for you. Below are the various clinics that will be offered including the days and times. The cost for a full 8 week session is \$240 and drop in sessions are \$40 per session.

Adult Beginner Clinic

Sundays at 9:00 am - 10:00 am A chance for beginners to learn the basics. Rackets and balls will be provided.

Adult Intermediate

Mondays at 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm

This clinic will help develop additional techniques and includes the introduction of movement, point construction and various spins. Techniques will be applied through drills along with singles and doubles match play.

Adult Level 3

Thursdays at 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm Recommended for NTRP Level 3.5+

This particular clinic focuses on proper technique, footwork, consistency and court awareness and will help develop the ability to play matches with proper tennis etiquette and sportsmanship. There will be an emphasis on live-ball drills and point play situations.

Private Lessons - Junior and Adult

Private lessons may be scheduled at your convenience. Private and semi-private lessons are geared towards maximum and accelerated improvement of the individuals game from the personalized and highly focused attention that is individualized to the clients specific needs.
