Baking corner

Spice Cupcakes

INGREDIENTS:

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 1/2 cup cornstarch

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

4 pinches ground nutmeg

4 pinches salt

12 tablespoons butter

1 1/3 cups sugar

4 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 cup milk



- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line 15 muffin cups with paper muffin liners.
- 2). Sift the flour, cornstarch, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt together in a bowl.
- 3). Beat the butter and sugar with an electric mixer in a large bowl until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, allowing each egg to blend into the butter mixture before adding the next. Beat in the vanilla with the last egg. Mix in the flour mixture alternately with the milk. Pour the batter into the prepared muffin cups.
- 4). Bake in the preheated oven until golden and the tops spring back when lightly pressed, 15 to 20 minutes.

COOKING CORNER! Mini Chicken Pot Pies



Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups cubed cooked chicken

1 can Campbell's Condensed Cream of Chicken Soup or Campbell's Condensed Fat Free Cream of Chicken Soup

8 oz. package frozen mixed vegetables (carrots, green beans, corn, peas), thawed (about 1 1/2 cups)

1 package (12 ounces) refrigerated biscuit dough (junior-sized, 10 biscuits) 1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

How to Make It:

 Heat the oven to 350°F. Spray 10 (2 1/2inch) muffin-pan cups with vegetable cooking spray. Stir the chicken, soup and vegetables in a medium bowl.

- Roll or pat the biscuits to flatten slightly. Press the biscuits into the bottoms and up the sides of the muffin-pan cups. Spoon about 1/3 cup chicken mixture into each biscuit cup. Lightly press the chicken mixture down so it's level. Top each with about 2 teaspoons of cheese.
- Bake for 15 minutes or until the biscuits are golden brown and the cheese is melted. Let the pot pies cool in the pan on a wire rack for 5 minutes.


