New Coding Elective Challenging Young Minds

This summer, Eagle's Landing offers a new computers coding elective. Through a partnership with KidsCoders, campers in grades 3-8 receive an introduction to coding and robotics with intuitive game-based lessons. Campers start with algebra games as a prerequisite to robots. The mathematics concepts are key in learning how to control the robots. After completing the introductory levels, campers learn to code by finishing sequences and conditionals before developing object-oriented scripts. Throughout these tasks, the campers are controlling one of 15 robots to follow a track, spin and fly through the air!

KidCoders likes to inspire girls in particular since women represent only 30% of programmers worldwide. Coding is hard but it can be a lot of fun, and we've seen kids demonstrate real potential!

Bake Shop MINT-CHOCOLATE BROWNIES

Ingredients:

Brownies:

1 box (1 lb 2.4 oz) Betty Crocker brownie mix (Water, vegetable oil and egg called for on brownie mix box)

1 cup (6 oz) mint-flavored chocolate chips

Mint Frosting:

1 cup vanilla frosting

1/4 teaspoon mint extract

1 drop green food color, if desired

Shiny Chocolate Glaze:

Reserved mint-flavored chocolate chips

- 4 teaspoons butter or margarine
- 4 teaspoons corn syrup
- 1 to 2 teaspoons hot water

Directions:

- Heat oven to 350°F (325°F for dark or nonstick pan). Grease bottom only of 9-inch square pan. Make brownie batter as directed on box and stir in 2/3 cup of the chocolate chips (reserve remaining chocolate chips for glaze). Spread batter in pan.
- Bake 36 to 41 minutes or until toothpick inserted 2 inches from side of pan comes out almost clean. Cool completely, about 1 1/2 hours.
- In small bowl, stir all frosting ingredients using spoon until well blended. Spread frosting over brownies.
- 4). In 1-quart saucepan, heat Glaze ingredients over low heat, stirring occasionally, until melted. Stir in hot water, a few drops at a time, until mixture is thin enough to drizzle. Drizzle over frosted brownies. Refrigerate about 30 minutes or until glaze is firm. For brownies, cut into 6 rows by 5 rows.

Special dietary concerns including kosher, gluten free, vegetarian and food allergies can be accommodated.

Eagle's Landing is "Peanut Aware." All of our food is free of nut derivatives, including peanuts. All of our food is baked or grilled and contains no trans fats. Nothing is fried.

Cooking Corner Potato-Onion Frittata

Ingredients:

- 1 pound (about 8) small new potatoes
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 small onions (about 1 pound), thinly sliced
- Coarse salt and freshly ground pepper
- 1 ounce sharp white cheddar cheese, grated (1/2 cup)
- 10 large eggs, whisked 1/2 cup sour cream

Directions:

- Place potatoes in a medium saucepan and cover with water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until tender when pierced with a sharp knife, 10 to 12 minutes. Drain; let cool. Peel and cut into 1/4-inch-thick slices.
- Preheat oven to 400°F. Heat oil in an ovenproof 10-inch nonstick skillet over mediumhigh heat. Cook onions until just translucent, about 2 minutes. Add potatoes and cook, stirring occasionally, until onions and potatoes are golden brown, 4 to 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.
- 3). Mix together cheddar and eggs. Season with salt and pepper. Reduce heat to medium. Pour egg mixture into skillet. Dollop with sour cream, and swirl into egg mixture using the tip of a knife. Cook until edge is set, about 2 minutes. Carefully transfer skillet to oven and bake until eggs are completely set, 10 to 12 minutes. Invert frittata onto a plate. Let cool slightly. Serve warm.
